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COURSE CONTENT:					
The course will lead students through an exploration of how languages and identity intersect in the Balkans (and beyond), and how these intersections have been portrayed in cinema.					
Course objectives:			Course learning outcomes:		

Cinema, as a visual and audio format, provides a unique artistic venue through which to portray, explore, and challenge the ways language and identity align, intersect, or are in conflict.

The course will introduce students to a wide array of historical and cultural debates about language and identity in the Balkans (and beyond) through film, while also facilitating conversations about how language, identity, culture, and politics intersect across the globe and in the places the students come from or where they are studying.

The course will introduce students to a wide range of documentary films and guide them on how to "read" such artistic works and how to view them with a critical eye.

Students will develop a deeper knowledge of the ways language and identity intersect in the Balkans (and beyond) and use that knowledge to reflect on how these factors relate in their own place of origin (or place of interest). They will develop a more critical eye for viewing film and for how film can be used to critique and reflect society.

TEACHING METHODS:

Lectures, exercises, discussions, course projects, homeworks, office hours (consultations) etc.

CONDITIONS FOR COURSE IMPLEMENTATION:

Classroom equipped with computer, projector and other IT devices.

STUDENT EVALUATION METHODS AND GRADING SCALE:

The course is subject to continuous evaluation. At regular intervals we also ask students to participate in a more comprehensive evaluation. Student evaluation is done by exam, and the final grade consists of the following components:
